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And so we bid farewell to a week of Rieslings and Spätburgunders. See our [guide to German Week](#) at JancisRobinson.com, and [Germany 2012 - a guide](#).

The residents of Maida Vale in north-west London are very lucky. While specialist wine retailers have come and mostly gone on British streets, they have had one excellent treasure trove of fine wines on their doorstep for decades. [The Winery](#) is the most delightful small, handpicked wine shop in the cluster of shops on Clifton Gardens, W9, currently owned by David Motion, who presumably funds his wine habit from his work in the music business.

He's a true enthusiast and the Germans should give him some sort of award because, fortunately for them, he happens to be extremely enthusiastic about modern German wine. He has long championed the sort of wine the Germans drink - as opposed to the fruitier styles that traditional British importers of German wine favoured for so long (he's a bit like [The WineBarn](#) and the new [German Wine Importers](#) in this regard). Most of the wines on the crammed shelves of The Winery (which really does look and feel like an old-fashioned pharmacy) are there because David Motion has personally gone to the regions to dig them out.

This tends to mean, in Germany at any rate, that he introduces a host of new names to his customers. He recently showed me a range of his latest finds, quite a number of them from producers entirely new to me. Knowing how much effort he puts into selection, I felt I was a little mean with my scores - but I can see that he is trying to find wines that will not be too expensive once he brings them in and gets them on his shelves. This, sensibly, means a preponderance of Kabinett trocken and Spätlese trocken - generally so much more reasonably priced than the [smart Grosse Gewächse](#) that Julia wrote about a week ago.

On his latest foray to Germany he seems to have concentrated on the newer, drier wines of the Mosel (see my article about [Loosen's dry wines](#) last Monday). The Melsheimer Riesling trocken 2011 looked a great buy to me, and an excellent introduction to hand-made new wave dry German wine. And all the Walter wines except an odd Riesling trocken 2011 would also be a useful starting point for someone curious about dry German Riesling. They're certainly a long way from classic Mosel, say the intensely fruity but featherlight glory of a Zilliken Saar wine, but these more potent dry wines are a testament to climate change, and lower yields, and are almost certainly easier to match with food.

I gave quite a number of these pungent, coiled-spring wines 16.5, with the von Racknitz (great name) Kieselstein possibly offering the best value. The Winery is certainly a happy hunting ground, not just for German wines but for a wide range of seriously interesting bottles, with particular enthusiasms also including hand-picked finds from California and Piemonte.
